
There is blue badge parking available on South Church Side.




The nearest multistory car park is on Market Place.




The train station is about a 15 minute walk away (1.1km).

Arriving



This is the welcome desk. You'll be welcomed by one of our staff members wearing black trousers, a light blue or black polo shirt. When it's cold they might be wearing a black fleece with a green logo.



We have a box of sensory resources like ear defenders, coloured filters for reading, a magnifier and a fidget toy.

You can borrow as many of the resources you need and carry them in one of our bags and bring them back before you leave.

The ground floor has a room about Victorian life which has toys, a school room, a storytelling area and a Victorian laundry.






The Victorian laundry is down a set of steps at the back of the room.




There is a storytelling area is up a set of steps at the back of the room.
