

The projections respond to movement.




The exhibition was made by 2 artists. Together they are called Genetic Moo.

Many of projections have creatures in them like starfish, spiders, maggots and lions.




One of the artworks is called Multiple.

The exhibition closes on September 7th 2025




Where can I see it?

We have bookable quiet openings on 6th July and 3rd August. Please visit www.hullmuseums/museum-events for more details.




Some of the lights in this exhibition have coloured filters on them and some of them move around making a colourful effect on the floor.

Sensory Suitcases



You can borrow a sensory suitcase to take round the exhibition.



The sensory suitcase has

- A plushy toy
- a pop-it fidget
- a torch
- a magnifier
- some goggles you can change the colour of the lenses in.



It has a visual timetable so you can plan your visit and share your plans with friends and family.



You will need to return the sensory suitcase to the bottom of the silver trolley when you leave the exhibition.

Microlab



Microworld has a play area called Microlab

The Microlab has 4 areas;

2. The quantum tunnel.

You can explore colour and shape on the lightbox.




- 4. The mini-lab station (designed for under 5s)
