Welcome

The Ferens has a magnificent collection of paintings and sculptures, including works by European Old Masters, portraiture, marine painting, and modern and contemporary British art.

Highlights include masterpieces by Lorenzetti, Frans Hals, Antonio Canaletto, Frederic Lord Leighton, Stanley Spencer, David Hockney, Helen Chadwick and Gillian Wearing.

With a regular programme of events, guided tours and changing exhibitions, there's always something new to explore. You can also enjoy refreshments in our popular cafe, Venue Hull.

We have an interactive gallery for under 5s called Explore Art, in wich children are invited to investigate Colour, Shape, Line and Texture through creative play.

At a Glance

ð Level Access

- The main entrance has level access with a ramp. The ramp is permanent.
- There is level access from the main entrance to:
 - Cafe
 - Ground Floor and Upper Floor–Galleries
 - Main entrance reception and information desk.
 - Public toilet for disabled visitors near the café between galleries 4 and 7
 - Ground floor shop

郑 Hearing

- The fire alarm has flashing lights.
- We have a hearing loop at the Information desk, café and shop counters.
- Many staff have had D/deaf Awareness Training.

🔷 Visual

- Glass doors have contrast markings.
- Some parts of the venue have low lighting.
- We have display information in large print.
- There are large print and braille maps of the museum available at the reception desk. We also have some raised, tactile and braille resources for some artworks.
- We have large print versions of the artwork labels available.

General

- There are 2 public toilets for disabled visitors.
- We have a café.
- Staff have disability awareness training.
- There is an accessible toilet for disabled visitors outside the Studio event space and near the café.
- All staff have disability awareness training.
- There are sensory resource boxes available at the front desk where you can borrow ear defenders, fidgets, coloured filters for reading text, magnifiers, weighted cushions, a torch and a TheraBand.

Travel by public transport

- You can get to Ferens Art Gallery by bus, train and boat or ferry.
- Monument Bridge bus routes 121, 60A, 66, PRX, X46, X55 stop here This bus stop is 83m or 272 feet (0.05 miles / 0.0 km) from Ferens Art Gallery Carr Lane bus routes 57, 51 stop here This bus stop is 84m or 276 feet (0.05 miles / 0.0 km) from Ferens Art Gallery The bus stop is 0.0 miles / 0.0 km from Ferens Art Gallery.
- The nearest train station is Hull Paragon Station. The train station is 0.3 miles / 0.5 km from Ferens Art Gallery.
- The nearest port is Port of Hull. The port is 3.3 miles / 5.3 km from Ferens Art Gallery.

• Accessible taxis should be booked in advance. It isn't possible to park outside the entrance, but drop offs can be made at City Hall.

arking

- There is parking near the venue. There are accessible parking spaces. Parking is not free.
- The nearest drop-off point is at Hull City Hall across the road. There are no parking facilities at the gallery, however there is a mutlistory carpark at Princes Quay next door to the gallery.
- There is on street parking on Saville Street and 9 designated disabled parking spaces on Paragon Street behind the City Hall. The surface from the on-road parking area and car park to the entrance of the attraction is a mix of both paved and cobblestones. There is very little lighting in this car park. Streetlights light the route to the attraction. From the car park to the entrance, there is level access. The route is 1200mm wide, or more.

- From the street to the main entrance, there is level access.
- There is a permanent ramp.
- The path is 1500mm wide, or more.

📶 Main entrance

- The main entrance has level access.
- There is a permanent ramp.
- The door is 840mm wide.
- The main door is sliding and automatic.

- We have contrast markings on all glass doors.
- Some parts of the venue have low lighting.

Lift

- We have 2 lifts.
- You can get a lift to all floors.

Central court lobby passenger lift.

- The lift door is 800mm wide.
- The lift is 1100mm wide. The lift is 1400mm deep.
- The lift says the floor number at each floor.
- The lift buttons have raised numbers or letters.
- The lift shows the floor number, at each floor.

nticket/ information desk

Main entrance reception and information desk.

- From the main entrance to the desk, there is level access. The route is 1500mm wide, or more.
- The route is more than 900mm wide and there is clear circulation.
- The reception point is in sight of the entrance and easily identifiable. The area is well and evenly lit by natural light and ceiling lights.
- If required, we have display information in large print.
- Staff are available to help customers who require assistance to navigate

Things to See and Do

• We have display information in large print.

Ground Floor and Upper Floor–Galleries

- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access. There is a lift.
- From the lift to this area, the route is 1100mm wide, or more. The door is 800mm wide.
- Some display information is low, for wheelchair users.
- There are seats at regular intervals.
- The upper gallery can be reached by a passenger lift situated near the lobby area.
- There is a dark area in Gallery 1 however there is lighting directed at the exhibits that aid navigation.
- There are sometimes screens with audio and subtitled presentations in our temporary exhibition galleries.
- There is sufficient lighting within the galleries and no dark areas or shadows
- There is an audio descriptive guide of gallery highlights, handsets available at the lobby area.

He Public toilet

Public toilet for disabled visitors near the café between galleries 4 and 7

• There is a public toilet for disabled visitors.

- From the main entrance to the public toilet, there is level access. The route is 800mm wide, or more.
- The toilet door is 800mm wide.
- The direction of transfer onto the toilet is to the left.
- There is 1000mm at the side of the toilet. There is 780mm in front of the toilet. The toilet seat is 480mm high. The toilets have handrails.

- There is level access.
- The direction of transfer onto the toilet is to the left.
- There is a public toilet for disabled visitors
- The toilet door is 800mm wide
- There is 780mm in front of the toilet. The toilet seat is 480mm high
- There is left hand transfer at this toilet

🏶 Shop

Ground floor shop

- From the main entrance to the shop, there is level access. The route is 800mm wide, or more. The route through the shop is 800mm wide, or more.
- From the main entrance to this area, there is level access
- There are a variety of seats with arm rests within the café eating areas
- There is level access to the outside eating area
- Merchandise is displayed on shelves up to a height of 1800mm and is accessible to visitors in wheelchairs.

Place to eat and drink

Venue Cafe

- From the main entrance to the dining area, there is level access. To get to a table, there are no steps.
- The route through the dining area is 800mm wide, or more.
- There is background music sometimes.
- The table and plates have high colour contrast.
- We cater for sugar free (diabetic), vegetarian, gluten free (celiacs), lactose free (dairy free), low fat and vegan specific diets.
- Table service is available on request.

Customer care support

Accessibility equipment

- We provide wheelchairs to borrow for free. We do not have a wheelchair or scooter charging point.
- We have a hearing loop at the Information desk, Café and shop counters and the Studio event space. We also have a portable induction loop for events in the gallery.
- We have an Audio Descriptive guide of gallery highlights. You can download the audio tracks to your phone by visiting https://vocaleyes.co.uk/audio-clip/ferensart-gallery/
- We have a basic floor plan available, also in braille and Large Print versions.
- We welcome assistance dogs and can provide water bowls
- There are sensory resource boxes available at the front desk where you can borrow ear defenders, fidgets, coloured filters for reading text, magnifiers, weighted cushions, a torch and a TheraBand.
- We provide wheelchairs to borrow for free. We do not have a wheelchair or scooter charging point.

Emergency evacuation procedures

- We have emergency evacuation procedures for disabled visitors.
- The fire alarm has flashing lights.
- In the case of an evacuation, all customers inside the Attraction will be led to safety by a member of the team or by a member of the fire brigade.
- We have Evac chairs to help with emergency evacuation from upper floors.

Customer care support

- All staff have disability awareness training.
- On large event days we set aside a quiet space this is usually in gallery 11, upstairs.
- We try to provide BSL interpreters for selected talks and performances, and provide accessible viewing spaces.

- Our quietest visiting times are from 2.30pm on weekdays termtime and Sundays.
- We have a quiet day at this museum on every 1st Sunday of the month. In August, it is often busier even on this day.
- We have seating around the gallery.
- The nearest Changing Places toilet is on the ground floor of the Wilson Centre. Please ask at the reception for directions.
