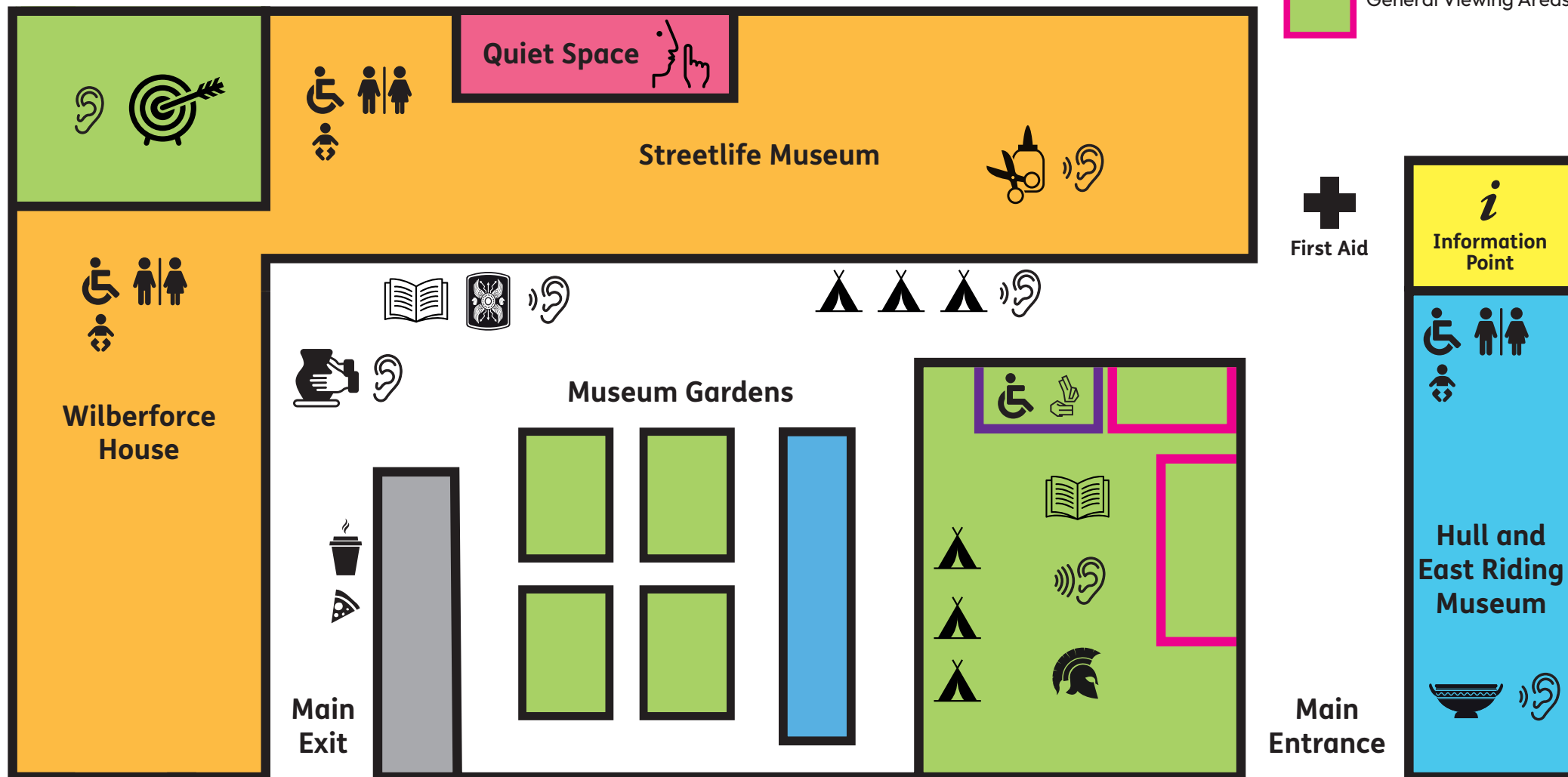

Getting to and around the site



All of our sites are wheelchair accessible.



Assistance dogs are welcome at our sites. Water bowls are available for assistance dogs at the museum front desks, please just ask.

Entrance and Exit – For visitor safety a designated main entrance and exit will be in place at the event. These are marked on the map. We understand that this will not be practical for all our visitors, so exceptions will be made where needed. Please just let the event stewards at the entrance and exit know if you need their assistance.

Quiet Space

Toilets and Changing Places



Toilets are available at all sites including an accessible toilet and baby change.



The nearest changing places are at The Guildhall on Alfred Gelder Street and in Trinity Market (accessed via a RADAR key which can be collected from any market vendor).
