





Quiet space - A small room for anyone in need of a quieter environment. Please ask at the front desk of the Streetlife Museum if you would like access.



A small number of ear defenders and sensory resources are available to borrow from the front desk of each site.



Portable stools - a small number of these can be borrowed from the front desk of the labelled sites for people who may find it difficult to stand during performances.

Toilets

There are toilets including baby change and accessible toilets in each museum.

Accessible viewing areas available 5 for musical and dramatic performances

The nearest **Changing Places toilets** are at The Guildhall on Alfred Gelder Street and in Trinity Market (accessed via a RADAR key which can be collected from any market vendor.)
