

Visual Story – Victorian Christmas at Hull Museums

‘Victorian Christmas’ is an event on in the Museums Quarter on High Street in Hull.



Entry to the event is free but some things cost money like the carousel ride, the arcade games in Streetlife Museum and visiting Father Christmas.



This is the entrance to the event. There are security staff at the entrance and exit dressed like this;



In the Museums Gardens we have a carousel.



The carousel is £3 a ride and you can get tickets from the blue building opposite the carousel. It looks like this.

On Saturday there is a jazz band playing.



On Sunday the Barton Community Brass Band and Victorian Carol singers are performing. There is a stage outside with music acts. If the weather is bad the music acts will move indoors.

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There are free craft activities at Hull and East Riding Museum and Wilberforce House Museum from 11am – 4pm on Saturday and 12pm – 4pm on Sunday.



There are signs in the museums pointing you towards the craft rooms.



The craft activities will include robins, wreaths, garlands and stars.

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Streetlife has the Hull Visual Choir performing on both days. They perform Christmas songs in British Sign Language.



Inside Streetlife there are some market stalls selling Christmas gifts.



There is storytelling in the cinema area at Streetlife. There are different time slots and some of these storytimes are BSL interpreted. Some of the story times are done by library staff.



Some of them are being done by another storyteller called Eden.
