


Easy Read Guide



This is an Easy Read guide to visiting **Spurn Lightship**




Spurn Lightship is an old ship that had a light like a lighthouse, to help other ships find their way at sea.



Hull Paragon Railway station is a 20 minutes walk away.



The Lightship



It is free to visit the Lightship.



You can book a ticket in advance

You can turn up on the day but you might need to queue.

You can't eat and drink on the ship.

Access



There is level access to the deck only.



Level access means you don't need to go up steps or a lift.

The deck is the top level of the ship.



Assistance dogs are welcome but will only be able to access the deck because of the steep ladders.



The film shown on the deck has subtitles and BSL.

Toilets



You can use the toilets at the Holiday Inn hotel, next to the ship

There is an accessible toilet and baby change.

Changing Places Toilet




Changing Places toilets are larger accessible toilets for people who cannot use standard accessible toilets.



They have equipment like hoists, curtains, adult sized changing bed and space for carers.

Our nearest Changing Places Toilet is at Trinity Market.

Trinity Market is a 10 minute walk away from The Spurn Lightship.


More Information

Lighting



It is darker in some of the area below deck because there are no windows.

Flooring



The deck is wooden and can be slippery.



Ladders and Doorways

You will need to step up and over all of the doorways downstairs.

Contrast




There are some poles below deck that are the same colour as the walls. These can be difficult for some people to see.

Sounds and Projections



There are also some projections and sounds to show you what life was like at sea on the Lightship.



In the crew's living quarters at the back, there are 2 sounds playing at the same time.



Streetlife Museum - Visual Story

Streetlife Museum has displays showing trains, trams, cars, bicycles, canopies, cabs and horses.

Our guided tours are after 14.30 on a weekday. We also tend to be quiet before lunch at the weekends if there isn't an event on.

It is free to visit the museum.

There is blue badge parking available behind on Cerdin Way (across the road from the main entrance). We have limited parking for minibuses. Call 01482 316733 to book.


The nearest larger car parks are on Osbourne street and a car park on Market Place.


