Experience timings

The site is closed to the public, so we are unable to offer self-directed time here. Self-directed time (and lunches for schools bringing 2 groups) are at the Hull and East Riding Museum of Archaeology.

If you are bringing two groups, we strongly advise you to book lunches and self-directed time unless your groups are arriving and departing from the site separately.

Session timings cannot be changed. There is a fixed 30-minute break between sessions if you are bringing two groups - this allows us to reset the room and resources.

National Curriculum links

History:

- KS2: The achievements of the earliest civilizations (Ancient Egypt)
- KS2: Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally

Ancient Egypt Experience outline:

- Introduction to our site and setting the scene about the historical period.
- Undertaking a tour of the Ancient Egyptian gallery in the Hands on History Museum and learning more about the replicas of Tutankhamun's tomb.
- Seeing a real mummy!
- Handling replica objects that depict key areas of Ancient Egyptian life, including helping pupils to learn about some of the Gods.
- Learning the process of mummification through an interactive demonstration.
- Discovering the history of the Rosetta Stone and its significance in deciphering the hieroglyphic language
- Writing on real papyrus paper in hieroglyphics.
- Plenary and evaluation.

Important information to help you prepare:

- Object handling activity your class will be split into three groups. We recommend that you bring a minimum of three adults per class with you to ensure each group is supported. An adult prompt sheet is provided for your adults to help facilitate this activity, whilst our member of staff will navigate around each group.
- Please note that one pupil will be 'mummified' during the session; therefore, please have in mind one child who would be willing to undergo the process in front of the rest of the class.
- An additional child will be required to act as Anubis (the god associated with mummification and the afterlife).

Key Vocabulary

Ancient, BC, AD, beliefs, Nile, Pharaoh, Sphinx, Tutankhamun, hieroglyphics, god, goddess, tomb, pyramid, canopic jar, mummification, Rosetta Stone, scribe, papyrus.

Post Visit Activity Suggestions

- Research about the life of Tutankhamen and the discovery of his time by famed Egyptologist, Howard Carter.
- Design and make a canopic jar depicting one of the four sons of Horus; Duamutef, Hapi, Imseti and Qebehsenuef.
- Write a set of instructions detailing the process of mummification during the Ancient Egyptian times.
- Design and make a death mask, taking inspiration from the replica of Tutankhamen's death mask at Hands on History.
