Experience timings

The table below lists timings for our Victorian Experience, whether you are bringing one or two groups, and then timings for lunches and self-directed time if you booked these via Eventbrite.

The site is closed to the public, so we are unable to offer self-directed time here. Self-directed time (and lunches for schools bringing 2 groups) are at the Streetlife Museum.

If you are bringing two groups, we strongly advise you to book lunches and self-directed time unless your groups are arriving and departing from the site separately.

Session timings cannot be changed. There is a fixed 30-minute break between sessions if you are bringing two groups - this allows us to reset the room and resources.

National Curriculum links

History – KS1:

- Changes within living memory
- The lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national or international achievements
- Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality

History – KS2

- A local history study
- A study of an aspect or theme in British history that extends pupils' chronological knowledge beyond 1066

Victorian Experience outline:

- Introduction to the site and setting the scene to the session and historical period.
- This session is delivered in character, beginning with a Victorian school teacher.
- Getting dressed up in Victorian-style costumes to immerse themselves in the past.
- Victorian school room experience – sit at original desks and take part in a typical Victorian lesson.
- Sit by the Victorian range and learn about home life, including the differences for wealthy and poor people at the time.
- Object handling activity focussing on Victorian home life – handle original Victorian artefacts relating to the roles of specific servants at the time.
- Plenary and evaluation.

Key Vocabulary

Copy book, slate, arithmetic, coal, blackboard, factories, machinery, mechanism, Dolly tub, posser, dolly stick, wash board, carbolic soap, washing, pegs, cleaning, cooking.

Post Visit Activity Suggestions

- Write a story from the perspective of a Victorian child who is going to school for the first time. The children should think back to the session and draw on how they felt when they met the teacher for the first time.
- Look at inventions related to the home. Research who invented them and how they have evolved over time.
