Transport Experience (2 hours) outline:

- Introduction to the site and setting the scene about the session.
- Interactive tour of the Streetlife Museum with Dotty, the Bus Conductor (this is delivered in character)
- Exploration of different types of historical vehicles (including an ice cream van, cars, steam train, trams, and a bus) making comparisons with modern day equivalents
- Getting on board a historic tram and bus
- A chance to get hands-on with original artefacts linked to a range of historical vehicles
- Taking part in a vehicle hunt identifying how vehicles were powered in the past and the materials they were made from.
- Observational drawing and comparing historic and modern vehicles.
- Plenary and evaluation.

Important information to help you prepare:

- We recommend that you bring a minimum of three adults per class with you to support your children during the visit. Our member of staff will lead the tour from the front in character. We appreciate your adults helping the children when moving around the museum.
- As part of the tour your class will be taken onto one of our historic trams and the bus. Please can adults from your school help the children to get on and off the vehicles due to them having steep steps.
- Your class will be split into three groups for the on-gallery activities (object handling, hunt and observational drawing) we ask that each group is supported by an adult. Our member of staff will navigate around the groups to support. Prompt sheets and instructions are provided for your adults to help facilitate the activities, whilst our member of staff will navigate around each group.

Key Vocabulary

Carriage, tram, bus, wheel, rail, tyre, train, electric, steam, petrol, horsepower

Post Visit Activity Suggestions

- Create a timeline of vehicles through time as a class display.
- Make vehicles from simple recycled materials such as boxes and bottle tops.
- Investigate the different ways that vehicles can be powered both now and in the past, e.g. electric, steam, petrol/diesel and horse-powered and talk about which ones are better for the environment.









• Write a story about travelling or making a journey using four different types of transport that the pupils saw during their visit to the Streetlife Museum.
